


How to use this Catalog:



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




Author Book Talks


Travels with Jim: Illusion, Perception, and Reality




The Dirty Little Secrets of Medical Training

Using Reality to Create Fiction









Justice for Stella




The Secret War of Henry Rebbenoff


Blending a Fictional Love Story with Real Historic Events


Felice and Ira's love story spanned almost four decades, from the beaches of Far Rockaway to the south shore of Long Island.

This workshop is designed to be either an introduction to creative writing fundamentals or a series of workshops that are tailored to a new creative writer. Ideally, it can be covered in six sessions, including exercises on building strong characters and setting, crafting engaging plots, mastering dialogue and voice, editing and revising, and publishing and sharing your work. The Personification Workshop


