The Carman's River: An Amazing Natural Beauty... by John P. Cardone



10. *Poetry's Meaning and The Poetry of History...* by Jeff Rimland




Sakhalin: Reality to Fiction... by Graham E. E. Bailey

Singing in Exile: The Vibrant Culture of Kerala Jews... by Pramila Venkateswaran



30. Everyone Loves A Mystery... by Lois Schmitt







Show Emotion, Instead of Talking About It... by Sandy Lanton





Photo-Books: The Art of Writing with Pictures and Text... by John P. Cardone


Author and photographer John P. Cardone conducts this workshop with his own photo-books, *Waterviews: A Collection of Photographs, Thoughts, and Experiences* and *Chronicles of a Nature Photographer* as references. This workshop includes an introduction to forming a cohesive plan while learning about editing methods for both the photo selection and accompanying text; selecting a book's theme; the type of photobook suitable for the subject; figuring out marketing potential; and, deciding if you are expert enough, as well as the business side of a photobook.



Writing with pictures is truly an art form, so John will discuss the best photo formats, how to select the book's dimensions, the best picture sizes, how to group photographs into topics and subjects, and deciding if the photos lead the text or if the text leads the photographs. In closing, John will draw from his experiences and point out some potential issues with the book's production steps—after all, no one wants to be pennywise and pound foolish.




The Personification Workshop... by ST (Tom) Young




Writing Free Verse Poetry... by Jeff Rimland




